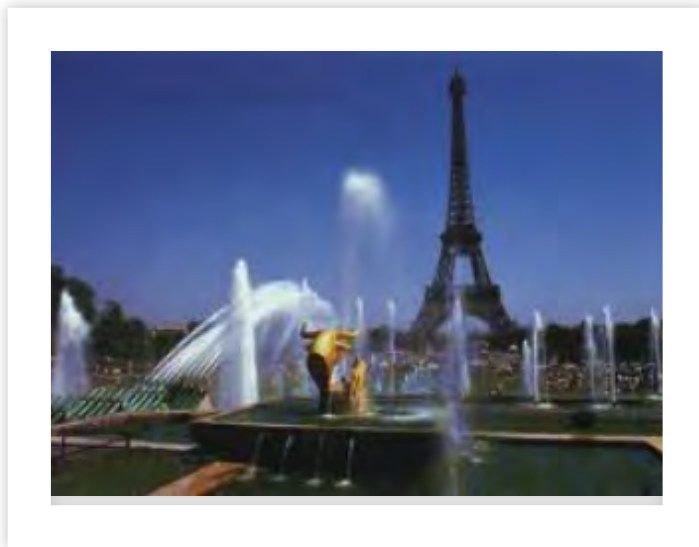

Day 3: April 20 (Paris) Breakfast

After breakfast, enjoy a half day tour of the Louvre Museum. The Louvre Museum holds the world's most comprehensive collection of Western art from antiquity to modern times. Only a sampling of the Louvre's 400 000 works of art are actually on display.



The Museum's collection is divided into seven categories of art: Oriental, Egyptian, Greek, Etruscan and Roman Antiquities, Sculpture, Paintings, Graphic art and art objects. The Louvre is also most famous for its vast collection of pre-modern. Among the most venerated artists displayed are David, Delacroix, El Greco, Fra Angelico, Franz Hals, Ingres, Rembrandt, Rubens and Leonardo da Vinci... It possesses an impressive assemblage of ancient treasures of which the Venus de Milo and the Winged of Samothrace are star pieces.

Day 4: April 21 (Paris, Reims- Champagne) Breakfast, Lunch

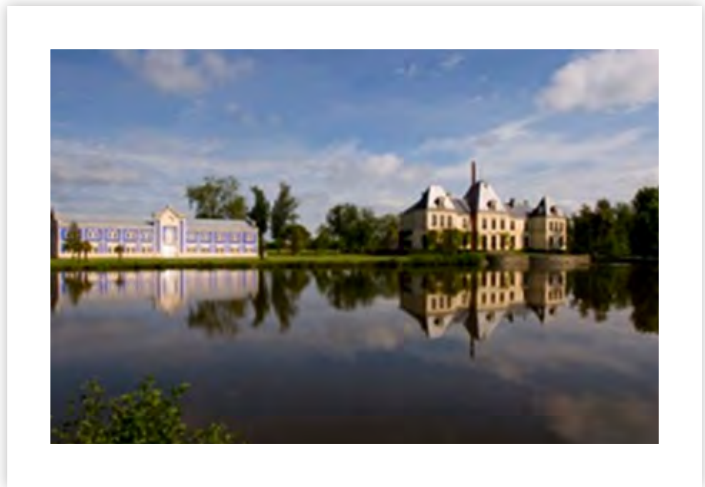
Full day tour of Reims – Champagne, one of the main gastronomic cities in France's. You'll enjoy Champagne tastings and a three course lunch with wine in the town.

Day 5: April 22 (Paris - Bordeaux) Breakfast, Lunch

Today we take the TGV high speed train to Bordeaux.

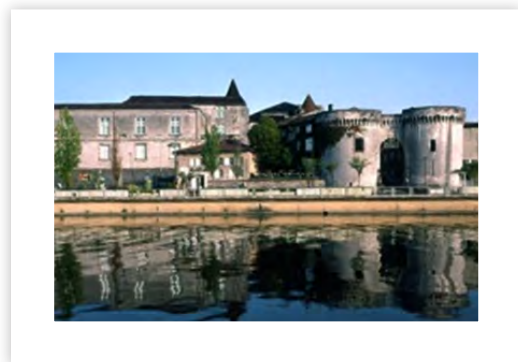
Upon arrival proceed to Le Wy for a three course lunch. Faithful to the global concept of La Winery, Le WY offers food-and-wine combinations in an airy, contemporary setting. Chef creates seasonal cuisine with respect for the ingredients as his watchword.



Without ever straying from the fundamentals of French gastronomy, Chef picks and chooses the best from modern methods to come up with flavoursome, contemporary, inspired cuisine. After lunch we visit Chateaux de Aillac for wine tasting and to determine your "wine profile". Regarded as one of the oldest wine estates of the Médoc region, Château d'Aillac has a rich and eventful history that can be traced back over nine hundred years.

Day 6: April 23 (Bordeaux - Cognac) Breakfast, Lunch

This morning we depart for a full day in Cognac. Cognac is a small city located in the Charente district, within the region of Poitou Charente. The district derives its name from La Charente, the Grand River, which together with the special terroir is vital to the success of this magnificent area of vineyards.



We cruise on the Charente river onboard of a la Dame Jeanne a traditional « Gabare » The heavy gabares (flat bottomed boats), loaded with stones from Saint Mème les Carrières or weapons made in Ruelle or eaux-de-vie from Cognac, used to go down the Charente river to the sea from where they returned loaded with salt from Brouage or the Ile de Ré.

Day 6: April 23 (Bordeaux - Cognac) Continued...

We then visit the Hennessy Company, The 1st international Cognac brand. All the different stages of the production will be explained as well as the story of Hennessy family. The visit will end with a tasting.



After our visit to Hennessy, we stop for a lunch on the Charente River Bank at La Courtine. La Courtine has been famous for its excellent traditional French cuisine for years. Nestled in the greenery of Park François 1st -the symbol of Cognac. La Courtine is just along the Charente River bank. You can enjoy your delicious fine French meal on the shaded terrace, or in the warmly decorated wood-panelled dining room. The restaurant is just next to the barge for a pleasure ride on the sweet Charente River, and boasts a large selection of grilled meat dishes, prepared in a modern and refined way with a focus on local products.

Day 7: April 24 (Bordeaux - Paris) Breakfast

After breakfast we take a half day city tour of Old Bordeaux. The first thing that strikes visitors to Bordeaux is the elegant architecture, reflecting the city's rich, 18th century heritage. Aristocratic squares and avenues lined with fine stone mansions and luxury shops give a feeling of unhurried spaciousness. Then it's fun to explore the narrower streets in the Old City, full of interesting boutiques, superb restaurants, relaxing cafés and traditional markets. A stroll along the river front reminds visitors of the days when the Garonne was the lifeblood of the city, full of proud sailing ships bringing in tropical wood and spices and sending fine wines all over the world.

We then take the TGV high speed train back to Paris (Black Paris).

Day 7: April 24 (Bordeaux - Paris) Continued...

This afternoon we explore and retrace the steps of famous African American who made Paris their home. This tour will take you back to the 30's of Josephine Baker, then to the Jazz golden years of Saint Germain des Prés, ending in the colourful African districts with their exotic markets.

Day 8: April 25 (Paris) Breakfast, Dinner

Today we take a half day walking tour of Montmartre. Visit the Bohemian village, located on the highest hill in Paris. Montmartre is the most romantic district, and has managed to retain its village atmosphere. You will discover its winding streets and cosy squares, which have seduced generations of artists, such as Picasso who once lived in this charming area. You will visit the Place du Tertre, square where all the Artist paint outdoors, surrounded by many typical French restaurants and street cafés, not to forget the famous Basilica of Sacred Heart dating from 1870, overlooking all of Paris.

This evening we reconvene for our farewell dinner on the Seine River. You will board the glass-covered boat on the most beautiful avenue of Paris, the Seine River. Gliding slowly under the 33 bridges of the Seine, they will follow the River's path through the heart of Paris, past landmarks straight from the pages of history.



From the Eiffel Tower to the Statue of Liberty, a singer and a musician make your discovery of the capital richer with

a commentary and famous songs. This delightful cruise on the romantic Seine River will be an experience you will long remember.

By signing our reservation form or clicking "I Agree" on our website, you agree to the following terms and conditions: Advantage International, LLC ("we" or "us") provides the tour named in our reservation form (the "Tour"). These terms and conditions apply to the Tour and the program for the Tour (the "Itinerary").

Payment Schedule: Not adhering to the payment schedule can result in cancellation without notice and/or rate increases.

- \$1000 per person non-refundable deposit - Due at the time of booking
- 50% of balance after initial deposit – Due by November 30, 2012
- Full and final payment due by February 28, 2013

All prices are in U.S. Dollars, and based on double occupancy. Due to exchange rate changes and other factors, we do not guarantee the amount of the final Tour Fee until the Full and Final Payment Date; after said date, we may increase the Tour price due to tax increases. Except as expressly stated in the Itinerary, you are solely responsible for any Tour-related costs that you incur.

In order to provide roundtrip airport transfers we must have flight information no later than 14 days prior to departure:

Change/Cancellation: Notice of change/cancellation must be made in writing to Advantage International, LLC, and your cancellation date will be the date we actually receive your notice: A name change is permitted on or before March 5, 2013 and will incur a penalty of \$50 per name change, on or after March 6, 2013 a name change may be requested, cannot be guaranteed and additional fees will apply. A date change is considered a cancellation. All changes are subject to availability, rate differences and are not guaranteed.

Cancellation:

- \$ 1000 per person is non-refundable if canceled - on or before November 29, 2012
- \$ 2000 per person is non-refundable if canceled – November 30, 2012 – January 15, 2013
- 75% is non-refundable if canceled - January 16 – March 4, 2013
- 100% of the total package price is non-refundable if canceled - on or after March 5, 2013, or if you are a no-show

We must receive your cancellation notice in writing by email, fax, or overnight courier, and your cancellation date will be the date we receive your notice. Your decision not to participate on the Tour due to State Department warnings, fear of travel, or the like will be deemed a cancellation. If a flight or other delay for any reason prevents you from joining the Tour on the Tour start date, you will be considered a no-show, and we cannot provide a full or partial refund or credit toward a future Tour, but you may join the Tour late if you wish.

Operator Cancellation or Substitution: We will make commercially reasonable efforts to keep the Itinerary as it has been published; however, the final Itinerary may vary due to availability and factors beyond our control. We may in our sole discretion substitute services such as hotels or goods of similar quality for any service or good stated in the Itinerary. If a tour is cancelled, our liability is limited to a full refund of your payments, and we will not be liable for any other costs, damages, or refunds of any kind for any loss, delay, inconvenience, disappointment, or expense whatsoever in such circumstances. If for reasons beyond our control, a Tour in progress must be interrupted or cancelled, we will in good faith consider refunding a portion of the price depending on our actual costs incurred compared to the Tour as originally contemplated.

Passports and Visas: US citizens are required to present their valid passport for France. Passports must have 2 blank visa pages per country and not expire before 6 months after last date of travel (October 30, 2013). All other nationalities must contact the consulates of each country (France) for documentation requirements. Proper documents are the responsibility and expense of each passenger. **Other Taxes and Fees:** Some governments charge departure taxes and/or fees. Facsimile transmission of any signed document shall be deemed delivery of an original. At our request, you shall promptly provide an original document as well. If there are any conflicts between this Participant Agreement, the Reservation Form, and the Itinerary, this Participant Agreement shall apply.
